INSTRUCTION

Religious-Related Activities and Practices

No religious belief should be promoted by the District or its employees, and none should be disparaged. Instead, the District should encourage all students and staff members to appreciate and be tolerant of each other's religious views. The District should utilize its opportunity to foster understanding and mutual respect among students and parents, whether it involves race, culture, economic background, or religious beliefs.

The District recognizes that one of its educational goals is to advance the students' knowledge and appreciation of the role that our religious heritage has played in the social, cultural, and historical development of civilization. Criteria used to guide academic inquiry in the study of religion shall seek the same neutrality, objectivity, and educational effectiveness expected in other areas of the curriculum. Instruction about religious matters and/or use of religious materials shall be objective, neutral, and non-devotional and shall serve a secular educational purpose.

Students and staff members may be excused from participating in practices that are contrary to their religious beliefs unless the District has an overriding interest in requiring their participation. Students and staff members who have been so excused will participate in an alternate comparable activity.
