

## COMMUNITY RELATIONS

### Safe and Orderly Learning Environment

A safe and orderly student learning environment is essential to the enhancement of student academic achievement. Therefore, the learning environment and staff's time for students shall not be interrupted unless necessary as determined by the building administrator. Procedures will be established to minimize disruptions.

Certificated staff shall be available for consultation with students and patrons before and after school as per WAC 180-44-050. Students and patrons are urged to make appointments with staff to assure an uninterrupted conference.

No one shall solicit funds or conduct private business with staff during the working day.

### Visitors

The Board welcomes and encourages visits to school by parents, other adult residents of the community, media representatives, and interested educators. The superintendent shall establish guidelines governing school visits to ensure orderly operation of the educational process and the safety of students and staff.

### Disruption of School Operations

If any person is under the influence of drugs or alcohol or disrupting or obstructing any school program, activity, or meeting, or threatens to do so or is committing, threatening to imminently commit, or inciting another to imminently commit any act which would disturb or interfere with or obstruct any lawful task, function, process, or procedure of any student, official, employee, or invitee of the school District, the superintendent or staff member in charge shall direct the person to leave immediately. If such a person refuses to leave, the superintendent or staff member shall immediately call for the assistance of a law enforcement officer.

### Outsiders at School

No student, during the school day while in attendance at any Central Kitsap school, shall come into contact with anyone except the following:

1. Other students.
2. School District personnel.
3. His or her parents or legal guardians or other persons present at school pursuant to a school recognized function, such as a volunteer.
4. Duly constituted public officials.
5. Speakers and/or participants in school approved activities, panels, recruiting, or classes pursuant to school District policies and procedures, including equal access policies and procedures.
6. Other persons specifically approved by the building principal.
